He was co-founder and chairman of the Nordic Innovation House New York and Nordic City Solutions. Overall, Ambassador Guðjónsson has 30 years' experience in international trade and investments. Vice-President's Report

On behalf of the President, I would like to thank everyone for their support and contribution to the ICCT club this past year. We had to move events to an online format and the many worked very hard to make this a smooth and successful transition.

We made the transition to online in the early days of the pandemic (March 2020). Our June picnic was online again. - Review of By-laws and updating the governance files for the club.
